Part A – JOB DESCRIPTION

Overall purpose of role	Under the guidance of a mentor, conduct and provide strategic, tactical and operational analysis in support of Counter Terrorism Policing (CTP) objectives. Produce analytical products using a range of analytical tools and methods, to support the decision making process for a range of CTP customers, internally and externally.
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Key outputs for role -

- 1. Lead by example and behave in line with the Police Code of Ethics ensuring that the force values and behavioural expectations are clearly understood and considered by managers, officers and staff in their decision making and actions; reinforcing and influencing them through all interactions and processes
- 2. Under the guidance of a mentor, be responsible for liaising with customers to provide and advise on the analytical requirements. Design and develop terms of reference and provide advice on analytical products, opportunities and limitations that may exist and to determine the best analytical product to use for the outcome required.
- 3. In conjunction with a mentor, liaise with customers/stakeholders and provide advice to determine the most appropriate analytical problem solving techniques to support tactical decision making relating to the tasking of resources in line with regional and national priorities.
- 4. As directed, provide analytical support to the Senior Investigating Officer (SIO) and key stakeholders, by compiling analytical products, profiles and reports to identify potential threats, risk, intelligence/evidential opportunities and knowledge gaps, to achieve operational objectives.
- As directed, prepare and provide analytical products to an evidential standard including the completion of Witness Statements where appropriate and attend court to present these as required, assisting in the decision making.
- 6. Under the guidance of a mentor, utilise creative and critical thinking when analysing information and intelligence from a range of sources to provide an assessment. Use Structured Analytical Techniques to develop and test inferences and hypotheses. Communicate and disseminate analytical findings, intelligence gaps and recommendations using the most appropriate method.
- 7. As directed, prepare and present, using information retrieved from a range of sources, strategic and tactical analytical products in support of the Regional/National Control Strategy and to inform the National picture.
- 8. As directed, provide real-time analytical support to live-time incidents in CTP-NE Region and/or in support of the national network priorities including preparing analytical products to inform SIO decision-making.
- 9. Comply with all relevant legislation, standards, protocols, procedures and guidelines.
